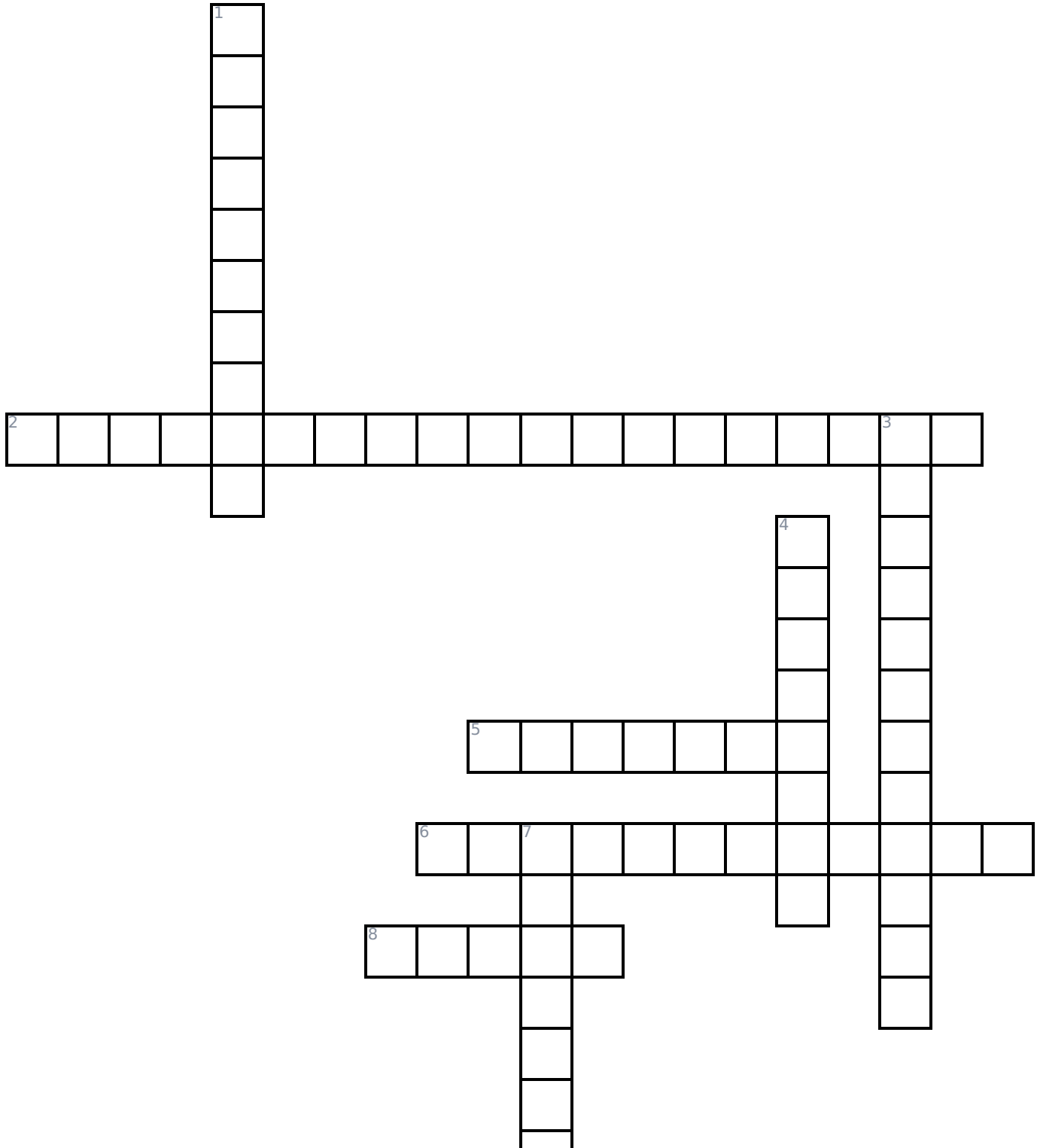


Killing Germs, Saving Lives: Criss Cross
