- **Chatter** Consider ways to get kids talking about reading. Find time to talk about a book and ask questions that help kids recap what they read. Think about creating a summer book club with friends.
- **Engagement** Discover new ways to incorporate reading into summer fun and daily routines. Read to or along with kids. Have kids set personal goals for books or materials read and find a fun way to record the books.
