
The Adventures of Bella & Harry:







Facts About Florence

- What is the name of the region Florence is located in? What country is Florence located in?
 Florence is located in the Tuscany region of Italy.
- 2. Where does the Arno River begin? Where does it end?

The Arno River begins in Monte Falterona and empties into the Tyrrhenian Sea.

3. Bella and Harry visited these two (2) museums.

The Galleria Degli Uffizi (Uffizi Gallery) and the Galleria dell'Accademia.

4. Name some of the artists that have works of art on display in the Florence museums.

Michelangelo, Leonardo de Vinci, Rembrandt, Raphael, Caravaggio and Botticelli.

5. What do you remember about the statue of David?

The statue was made by Michelangelo; it has been at the Galleria dell'Accademia since 1873; it is seventeen (17) feet tall; it is made of marble; David has no clothing on.

6. What is another name for the Piazza del Duomo? What three (3) religious buildings are located there?

It is also called Cathedral Square. The Florence Baptistery, Florence Cathedral and Giotto's Campanile Tower are located there.

7. What do you remember about the Florence Baptistery?

It is also known as the Baptistery of Saint John; it is shaped like an octagon; it has three (3) sets of bronze doors; the doors were designed by Andrea Pisano and Lorenzo Ghiberti and each square on the doors shows a different religious scene.

8. What do you remember about the Florence Cathedral?

The Florence Cathedral is also referred to as the Cathedrale di Santa Maria del Fiore (Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Flowers); it is the main church in Florence; the dome is made of brick; it is the largest brick dome ever made; many people also call this church il Duomo or il Duomo di Firenze.

9. What do you remember about Giotto's Campanile Tower?

This thin tower is 277.9 feet tall and there are seven (7) bells in the tower.
