
The Birthday Swap

RELATED ACTIVITIES

TÍA SABINA'S BAKED CRISPS

Ingredients: 4 flour tortillas, spray vegetable oil, cinnamon sugar

Cut tortillas into triangles. Place on baking sheet. Spray lightly with oil. Bake at 400° for 5-8 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar. Let cool. Enjoy!

BIRTHDAY PIÑATA

Materials: balloon, newspaper, water, flour, paint, paint brushes, streamers, tissue paper

Day 1: Blow up balloon. Mix 1 part water and 2 parts flour; stir until it looks like thick glue. Dip strips of newspaper in mixture. Cover balloon with 2 layers of strips. Leave a hole at the top for candy. Let dry.

Day 2: Repeat process.

Day 3: Paint piñata bright colors. Add streamers. Pop balloon. Put candy inside piñata and cover hole with tissue paper. Hang it up and let kids take turns whacking it to get the candy out!





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
