#### TIME TO READ!

BEFORE WE READ, LET'S LOOK AT...

**The Cover:** "What do you think the problem of this story is going to be based on this picture?"

**The Pictures:** The thrill of this story is the humor and suspense. Use only the title page picture to begin a discussion with students about their familiarity with hamsters.

**Prior Knowledge:** Ask students what the word *memoir* makes them think of. Explain that a memoir is a written account of someone's personal life experiences in the past. In this case, Seymour the hamster is writing the memoir. Contrast memoir with diary.


Vocabulary: hydrated, marathon, shimmied

**Purpose for Reading:** "The author provides clues about hamsters through Seymour's memoir. Focus on the inferences you can make about the lifestyle of a real hamster using those clues."

## WHILE WE READ

#### MONITORING COMPREHENSION

- Where do you think Seymour was prior to night one?
- Who is the narrator of the story?
- Does Pearl remind you of a cat from another story? Explain.
- Who do you think Hoover is?
- Do you think Buck knew about Pearl's plan?



## **LET'S THINK ABOUT**

Our Purpose: "What inferences were you able to make about real hamsters based on the author's clues?"

**Extending Our Thinking: Ask these open-ended questions:** "What character traits would you use to describe Seymour, Pearl, and Buck? Do they have any similar traits? Pearl was a trickster. Can you think of other tricksters you have read about? Who are they and what were they trying to get? Do you notice any common goals?"
