# TIME TO READ!

#### BEFORE WE READ, LET'S LOOK AT...

**The Cover:** What can you tell about the setting—time and place—of this story based on the cover illustration?

**The Pictures:** Flip briefly through the pictures. Ask children what else they can learn about the time period in which the story takes place based on the pictures. What specific details do they notice?

**Prior Knowledge:** What famous aviators are students already familiar with? Are any female? Let students

**Vocabulary:** aviatrix, feat, luck, provisions, turbulence, vaudeville

Purpose for Reading: As we read, think about what the overall theme of this story might be.

#### MONITORING COMPREHENSION

- What motivates somebody to be the first at trying something?
- Where does courage come from?

- Why do you think Ruth became famous even though she did not reach her goal?
- Do you think some people may have wanted to see her fail? Explain.

## LET'S THINK ABOUT

**Our Purpose:** What do you think is the overall theme of this story? What evidence from the text supports your answer?

**Extending Our Thinking:** How have ideas about women's accomplishments changed since the 1920s? Many people have never heard of Ruth Elder although her name was in the headlines of many newspapers. Why are some people remembered more than others? Is a person's contribution more important if that person is remembered? Explain.
