BEFORE WE READ, LET'S LOOK AT...

The Cover: What can you tell about the time period the story is set in based on the cover illustration? Explain.

The Pictures: Flip briefly through the pages. How do the pictures help you create a *visual timeline* of this period in history and the life of Antoine de Saint-Exupéry? What details in the pictures stand out to you?

WHILE WE READ

MONITORING COMPREHENSION

- What motivates a person to try something?
- Do you think he could have talked someone into letting him fly?
- What did he have to learn about before he could fly?

- What would you do if you crashed? Would you continue to fly?

LET'S THINK ABOUT

Our Purpose: What do you think is the overall theme of this story? What evidence from the book supports your answer? Ask students to share their answers and make a list of the themes they suggest.

Extending Our Thinking: How has technology changed air travel since the early 1900s? If you had lived back then, would you have wanted to fly or would you have been too scared? Explain your answer. Many people have never heard of Antoine although he wrote a very famous book. Why do you think some people become more famous than others? Does being less famous make your achievements less important? Discuss your answer with a partner.
