

TIME TO READ!



Before reading, build background: Talk with your child about aspirations: interests, hopes, and dreams that people develop throughout their lives. Discuss any particular interests your child has and what they would do if they were told to stop pursuing them.

While reading, make predictions: Will the Drum Dream Girl overcome the challenges she faces and be able to play her music out loud?

After reading, ask questions:

- What was the Drum Dream Girl dreaming of?
- Why couldn't the Drum Dream Girl continue playing with the all-girl band?
- Who helped the Drum Dream Girl get even better at drumming?
- How did the Drum Dream Girl and her playing in the café change people's minds about girls playing drums?

DIY DRUMS

Materials: Found items around the house that can be used as drumsticks and drums. For example, pencils and straws could be drumsticks, and boxes and books could be drums.

Find a pair of "drumsticks" (found objects) and at least three items that can be played as drums, either three different types of drums (e.g., a pot, a box, and a book) or three varieties of the same

thing (e.g., small, medium, and large boxes). Play all the drums and take note of their different sounds. Make
