
Discussion Guide for Families

Themes: Nature, Family

Book Brief: A story about a girl and her grandfather exploring nature in their red canoe. They see ducks, birds, and other animals.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

Model how to connect to the story by sharing your own observations and experiences related to nature and the outdoors.

While Reading: Make Connections

While reading the story, talk to your child about how the characters might be feeling at different points in the story. Consider questions such as: "How do you think the girl feels when she sees the osprey catching a fish?" or "Why do you think the grandfather smiles when they see the stars at night?"

After Reading: Ask Questions

If you could go on a canoe adventure with someone, who would you choose and where would you go?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book, consider:

Take your child on a nature walk in a local park or reserve or plan a canoe trip if possible. Encourage them to observe and appreciate the plants and animals they encounter, just like the characters in the book.
