BEFORE READING

The Cover: Ask students to make a prediction about the story based on the cover and title.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice.

Prior Knowledge: Ask, "Have you ever surprised someone by doing something brave? How might that feel?" Explain to students that this story is about real events, but it is told like a story with characters, a setting, and events in order.

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying <u>Vocabulary Guide.</u>

Purpose for Reading: "As we read, think about the ways in which Joan showed courage."

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- Describe the village in France during this time. What was it like? What was taking place?
- Why are Joan and her family feeling scared?
- What decision(s) did Joan make? How does this show courage?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: "How has Joan become an inspiration for those who are fighting for peace?"

Extending Our Thinking: Have students write a journal entry from the perspective of Joan. Ask, "Imagine you are Joan the night before she meets the Dauphin. What thoughts, hopes, and worries would you write in your journal?"
