READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

- Ask, "Have you ever noticed something or thought about things in a way that was different from others? What was it?"
- Explain to your child that this story is about a real person named
 Temple Grandin who sees and thinks about the world in her own special way, and how this helps her do amazing things.

While Reading: Make Connections

- What is Temple like? How does she see or experience the world differently?
- What is Temple interested in? What does she love to learn about?
- Describe how Temple uses her unique way of thinking to help others.
 What does she create or discover?

After Reading: Ask Questions

 Ask, "How did Temple's different way of thinking help her make important discoveries? What does her story teach us about being yourself?"

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book:

- Go on a "Different Perspectives Walk." Take a walk together and challenge your child to notice things in new ways: look at objects from different angles, listen carefully to sounds, or observe how animals behave. Talk about what they discovered by looking at things differently, just like Temple did.
