BEFORE READING

The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about Cynthia.

Prior Knowledge: Ask students, "What is something that makes you confident? How does it make you feel?"

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying <u>vocabulary guide</u>.

Purpose for Reading: "Let's read to find out what makes Cynthia Erivo shine in the spotlight."

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- How did Cynthia's talents show at a young age?
- Describe how Cynthia handled being the new kid in school.
- What do you think would have happened if Cynthia hadn't enrolled in Royal Academy?
- Compare what Cynthia has in common with one of the roles she plays.

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: Cynthia's talent strengthened over the years. What makes Cythnia Erivo shine in the spotlinght?

Extending Our Thinking: Using <u>RIF's Main Idea and Graphic Organizer</u>, have students find the main idea of the story and use details from the text to support it.
