
Read Aloud Guide for Families

Book Brief: The inspiring true story of Wangari Maathai, a girl who loved nature and grew up to plant millions of trees and change the world!

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

- Ask, "Have you ever planted something and watched it grow? How did it make you feel?"
- Explain to your child that this story is about real events, but it is told like a story with characters, a setting, and events in order.

While Reading: Make Connections

- What does Wangari love? How does she show her love for nature?
- What problem does Wangari notice in her community? What's happening to the trees?
- What does Wangari do to help? How does she make a difference?

After Reading: Ask Questions

Ask, "What is the most important thing Wangari does? How does her love of nature help her community?"

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book:

- Plant (or draw) something together. Help your child plant seeds in a pot or garden, or care for a plant you already have. Talk about how taking care of living things helps the environment, just like Wangari planted trees to help her community and the earth.
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
