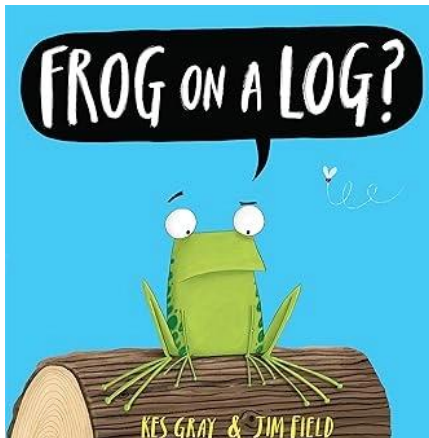


# Read Aloud Guide for Families



## Frog on a Log?

**Author:** Kes Gray

**Illustrator:** Jim Field

**Themes:** Rhyming, Funny

**Book Brief:** In this playful rhyming story, a frog questions why animals must sit in certain places and discovers a funny surprise along the way!

## READ ALOUD

---

### Before Reading: Build Background

- Ask, "Do you have a favorite spot to sit? Why do you like sitting there?"

### While Reading: Make Connections

- Where does the cat say each animal should sit? Why does the cat think frogs sit on logs?
- Does the frog want to sit on a log? Why not? What does he want instead?
- What rhyming words do you hear in the story? Can you think of other words that rhyme?
- What does the frog finally discover? Where do dogs sit?

### After Reading: Ask Questions

- Ask, "What happens in the story? Why does the frog ask so many questions? What funny surprise happens at the end?"

## RELATED ACTIVITIES

---

### If your child enjoyed this book:

- Play a rhyming game! Take turns naming animals and thinking of rhyming places they could sit (like "bee on a tree" or "mouse on a house"). Draw pictures of your silly rhymes, just like the animals in the story.
- Practice saying and clapping out rhyming words from the book together.
