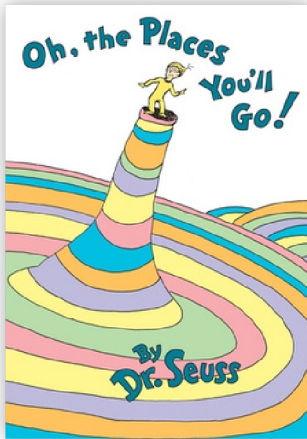




Oh, the Places You'll Go!

Book Brief: A rhyming send-off that follows one character through soaring highs, lonely lows, and the pull to just keep waiting, landing on the message that setbacks are part of the journey forward.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

- Tell your child people often give this book for graduations and fresh starts.
- Ask your child to name one new thing they will try soon.

While Reading: Make Connections

- Have you ever felt stuck? What did you do?
- What do you think waiting feels like?
- What helps you feel brave when you're alone and stuck?

After Reading: Ask Questions

- What does Dr. Seuss want them to remember when things get hard?
