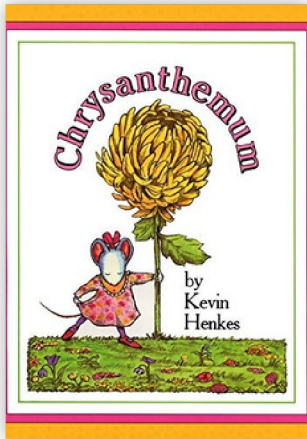




Chrysanthemum

Themes: Belonging, Bullying and teasing, Family, Identity, Self-worth

Book Brief: A young mouse named Chrysanthemum loves her name until classmates tease her about it at school. With her family's support and a beloved music teacher's help, she learns to treasure who she is.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

- Tell your child that a chrysanthemum is a real flower, sometimes called a "mum." The girl in this story is named after it.
- Talk about how your child's own name was chosen. Ask what they know about their name's meaning or story.

While Reading: Make Connections

- How do you think Chrysanthemum feels when her classmates laugh at her name?
- What do her parents do when Chrysanthemum comes home sad?
- Why do you think Mrs. Twinkle praises the name Chrysanthemum?

After Reading: Ask Questions

- Have you ever felt different like Chrysanthemum? What helped you feel better?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book:

- Make a name banner together. Help your child write their name in big letters and decorate each one. Talk about what makes their name special.
