**Book Brief:** Celebrate our differences and


similarities through a playground rap.

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### **TIME TO READ!**

**Before reading:** Ask for some volunteers to come up and discuss their similarities and differences. Talk about how we are all different in many ways but still the same in others.

# **RELATED ACTIVITIES**

#### **SIMON SAYS THE OPPOSITE! (AGES 5-12)**

Play this game like the regular version of Simon Says, except do the opposite of what Simon says. For example, if Simon says clap loud, you clap soft. If Simon says run fast, run slow. If Simon says touch your head, touch your toes. If Simon says turn to the right, turn to the left. See how many opposites you can come up with!

#### **INKBLOT ART (AGES 5-12)**

Materials: paper, paint, paintbrushes

Create imaginative opposite inkblot pictures. Fold



paper in half. Have kids paint a design or picture on exposed half. When finished, fold paper back over and press lightly to transfer painting. Peel apart slowly.

# OPPOSITES COLLAGE (AGES 8-12)

Materials: magazines, glue, scissors, paper Divide paper in half. Label each side

with opposing characteristics (tall/short, happy/sad, fun/boring, etc.). Find pictures to represent each. Create a collage by cutting out pictures

and gluing them to the paper.
