TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Ask children what they know about slavery during the American Civil War. Explain that this book is a true story about a slave named Dave, a skilled craftsman and poet who lived during that period.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

RHYME TIME (AGES 9-12)

What if you could only talk through poetry? Draw a comic strip or write a short story or play about the day you woke up and found out you could only talk in rhyme. What happened? Was anyone else affected? Remember to make all of the dialogue, or talking, poetry!

PLAY DOUGH POTS (AGES 7-12)

Materials: play dough (you can find a number of recipes at www.easy-kids-recipes.com)

Provide each child with a mound of play dough. Let them try different ways of constructing a pot or vessel. After they have chosen and made a design, have them use a toothpick to sign and date their work. Allow the pots to dry. If desired, children can paint the pots when dry.



CLAY NATION (AGES 5-12)

Most cities offer programs that include pottery classes for young children. Are there any programs like this in your area? Contact the coordinator and see if an instructor would be willing to speak with your children about pottery and how it's made. You might also reach out to a local artist or group of artisans.
