

TIME TO READ!

Before reading, build background: What does your child know about elephants? Where do they live? What do they eat? How do they communicate?

While reading, make connections: Does Liza's mother remind you of one of your family members?

What kinds of activities does Liza enjoy that you might enjoy? How does your family help you?

After reading, ask questions:

- Why was it important for Liza to stay close to her family members?
- What are the biggest dangers Liza and other elephants face?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

ELEPHANT TREATS

Ingredients: uncooked canned biscuits

Use dough from one of the biscuits to make 2 large ears and a long trunk. Stick the pieces onto another biscuit to make a dough elephant. Repeat until all dough has been used. Bake at 350* for 17 minutes. When cool, slice the biscuit in half and enjoy with butter or jam.

DESERT MYSTERY BOX

Materials: shoebox, mystery items (suggested items include a spiky rubber ball [cactus], silk flower [desert flower], rocks, small bag of sand)

Make a mystery box for your child to practice using their sense of touch. Cut a hole at each end of a shoebox. Put one "desert item" inside. Let your child reach inside, use adjectives to describe what they feel, and guess the object. Afterwards, open the lid

and see if the guesses were correct. After each object is revealed, talk about its connection to the desert.

WORTH A THOUSAND WORDS

Materials: digital/cell phone camera and computer access OR old magazines, scissors, paper, and glue

Tell the story of a day in your life using pictures. Take pictures of yourself and your daily activities on a digital camera or cell phone.
