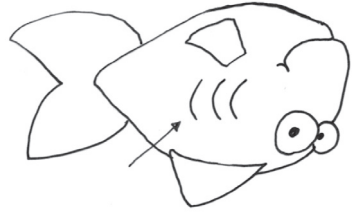


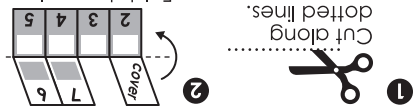
Who Has Gills?

There are many kinds of fish.

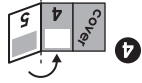

4 Fold pg. 5 over on top of pg. 4

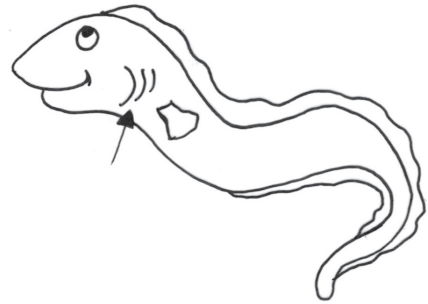


5 Fold pg. 7 over on top of pg. 6

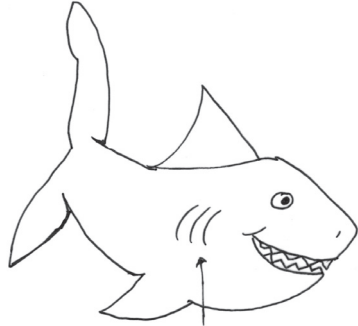


6 Fold back along middle (cover pages face inward)

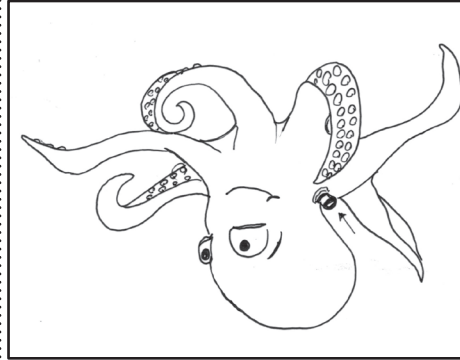
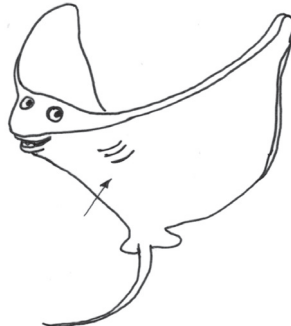
Eels have gills.
