

TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Do the children know how important trees are for the planet? Have them brainstorm all the things trees give us (food, lumber, oxygen, shade, etc.). Locate Kenya on a map or globe so kids know the setting of the story.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

WANGARI'S TREES (AGES 4-6 YEARS)

Materials: paper, crayons or markers, sponge, green paint, clothespins (optional)

Have kids draw tree trunks on a piece of paper. Cut up a sponge to dip in green paint. Use a clothespin to help kids hold onto the sponge. Dip the sponge in paint and dab on the paper to make leaves for the trees.

COMMUNITY GARDEN (AGES 4-12 YEARS)

Materials: seeds and/or plants, gardening supplies

Start a community garden project at your center. Kids can plant, water and take care of seeds/plants. Have them record what they see each week. Use pots if planting space is limited. Try to grow a few fruits or vegetables so kids can enjoy snacks fresh from the garden!

GARDEN IN A BOTTLE (AGES 9-12 YEARS)

Materials: 2 liter bottle, dirt, seeds

- Clean out a 2 liter bottle and remove the label. Cut the bottom off and fill it with dirt.
- 2. Plant some seeds and sprinkle with water. Put the top of the soda bottle back onto the bottom and place in a sunny spot.
- 3. Help children track the progress of the plants that grow in your bottle.
