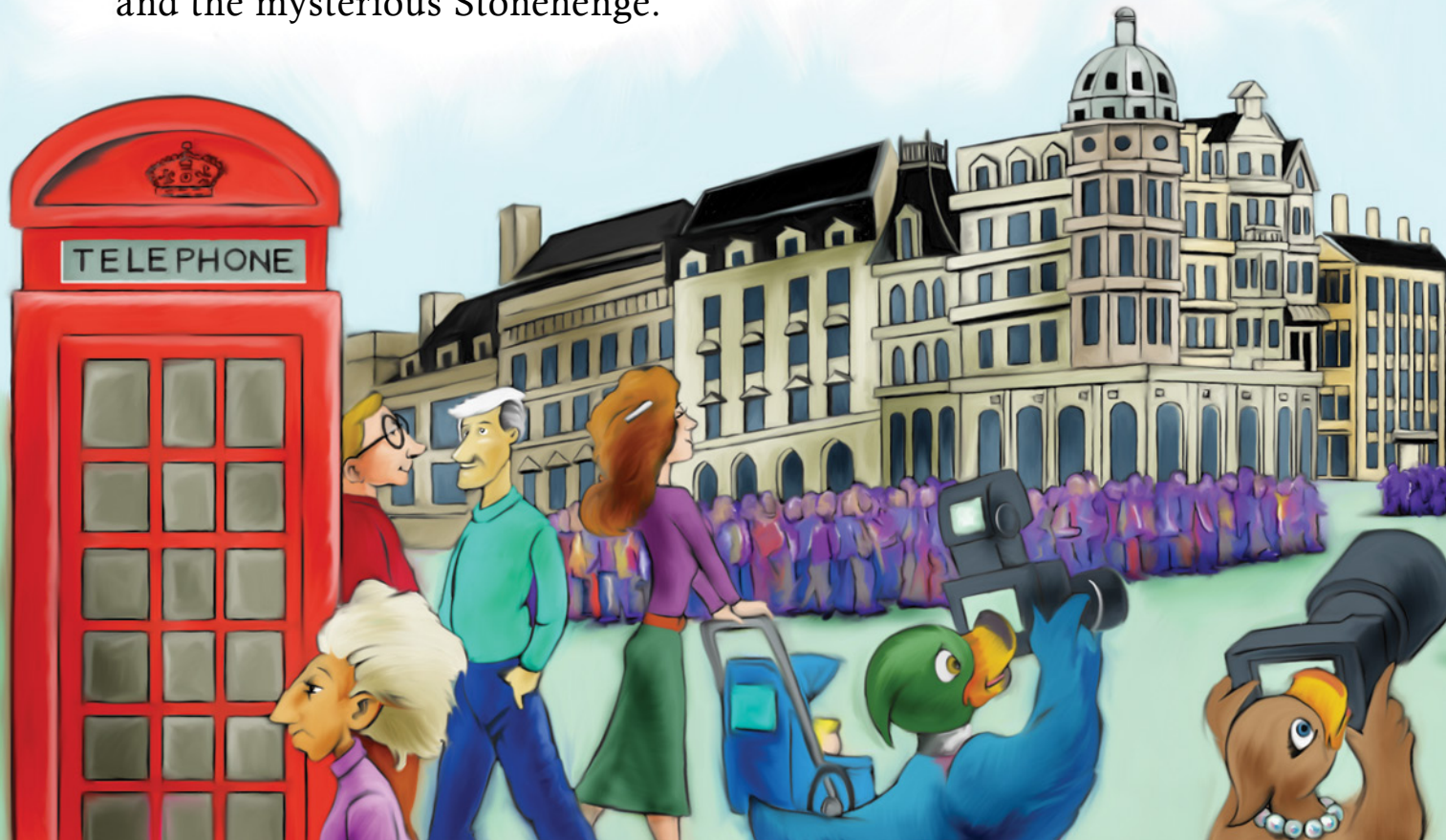
S

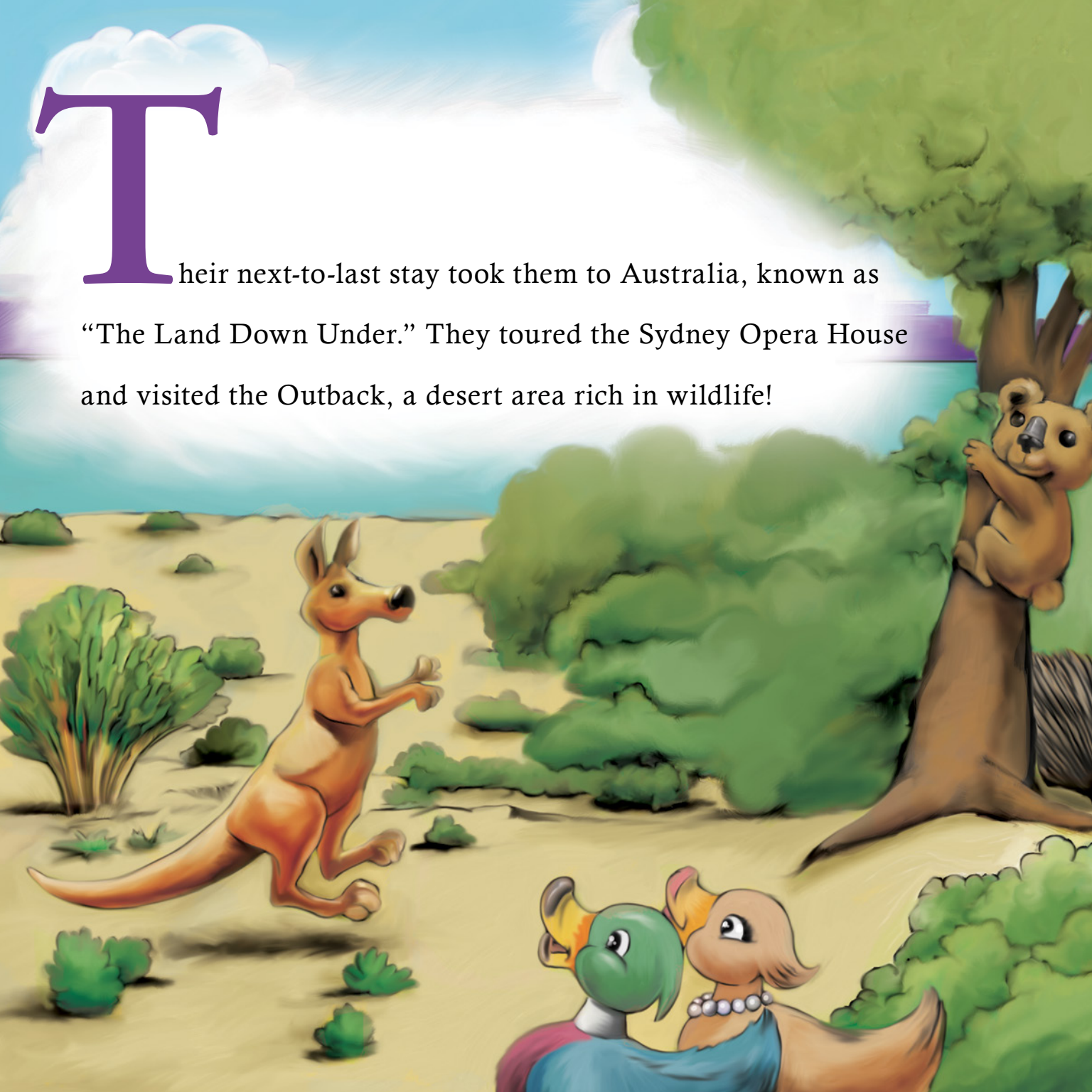

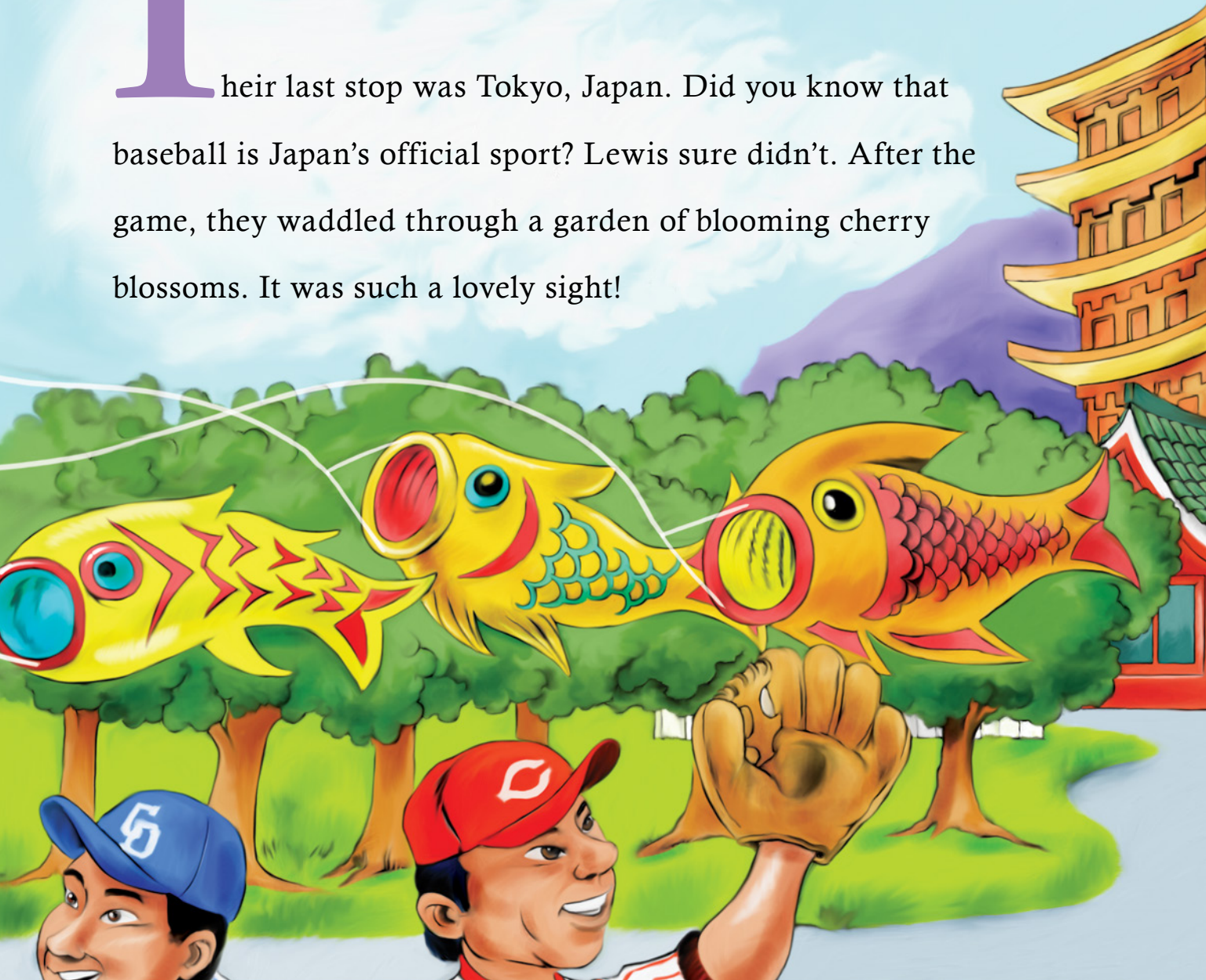

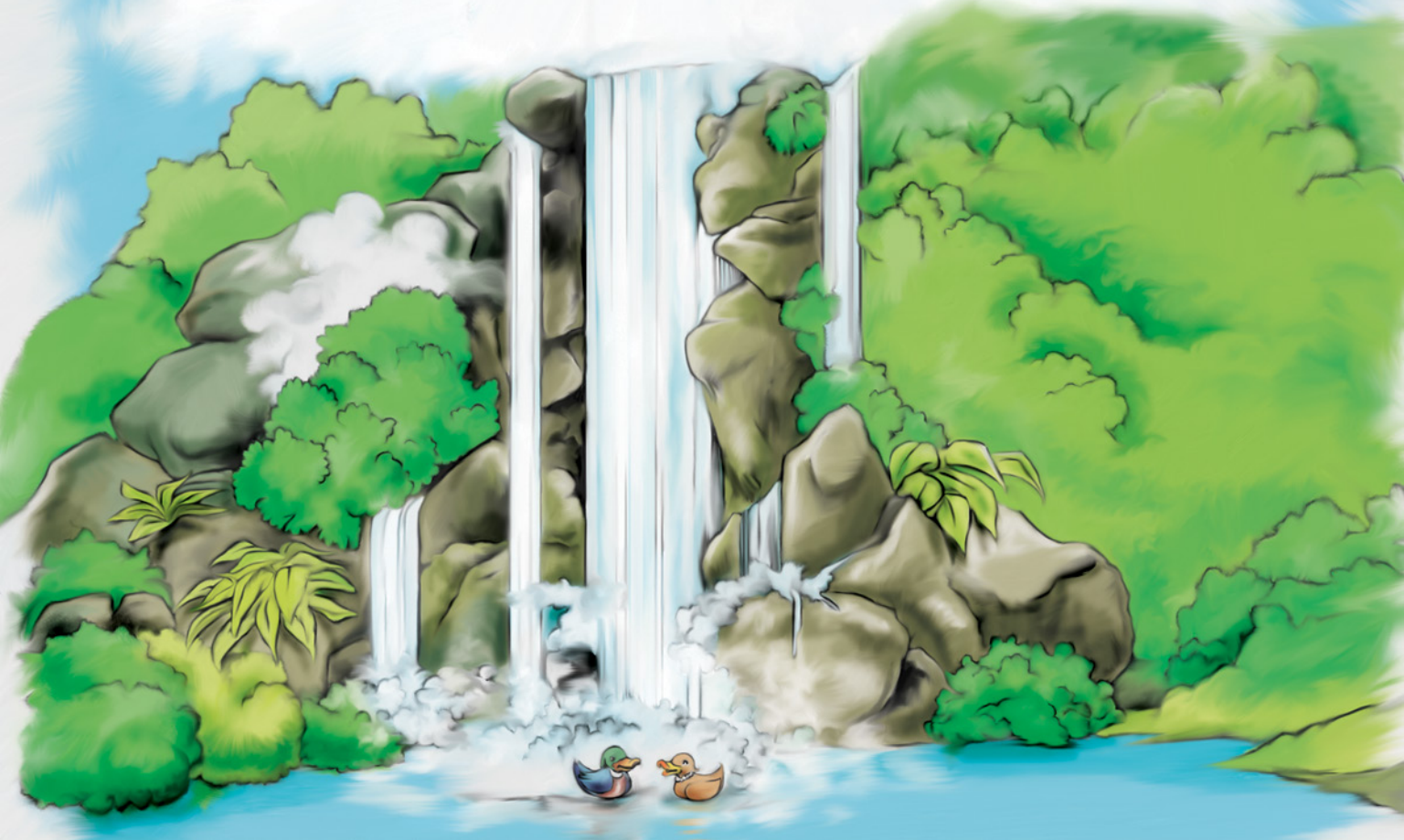
