






His boss, Mr. Wood, had asked to meet with him. Lewis wondered what he could want.









His wife smiled. "It's okay," she said. "Birds of a feather flock together. I'll make sure we keep in touch every day.



bed it was... big, comfy and topped with a pillow that looked custom-made for Lewis.












hat day, Lewis had a great time working on his special project. When he came back to Homewood at the end of the day, he worked out in the fitness center and had a swim before dinner.





hen he got back to his suite, he called his wife.

"Honey, you've got to see this place – you would just love it here!"


His wife replied, "I'm glad your trip is going well! Lewis, the kids are so excited. They sent you an email. See if you can open it."
