

# **TIME TO READ!**

**Before reading, make connections:** Does your child play baseball or any other sports? Do they have any favorite activities or hobbies? How would they feel if they had to stop just because of what they look like?

While reading, follow the characters: Louis has a dream. What does he do to reach that dream? What challenges does he face?

## After reading, ask questions:

Where did Louis grow up?

- ◆ How did he help his father?
- How was Louis treated by many baseball fans? Why?
- How did Louis react to the fans?
- ◆ How do you think he felt?
- Do you think you could have done anything to help him?
- What are some ways to stop bullying?

# **RELATED ACTIVITIES**

#### **HOT DOG!**

Hot dogs are a favorite treat at baseball games. Try this version for a quick snack.



Ingredients: 8 hot dogs, 1 can of crescent rolls

Wrap each hot dog in a crescent roll. Bake at  $350^{\circ}$  for 15-18 minutes. Serve with mustard or ketchup for dipping.

#### **OUT AND ABOUT**

Play stickball in your yard or neighborhood (rules available online: www.streetplay.com/rulesheets/stickball).

Use a broomstick for a bat and a tennis or whiffle ball. Use whatever you can find as bases (flower pots, the corner of the house, etc.). Have fun! Younger kids should have a parent or other adult watching at all times.
