Materials: big paper or poster board, markers

Let each group share with the class. After each
group presents, have the class draw comparisons

between Kenya and the US or your city/state.




WRITING

SCIENCE/MATH


CLASS GARDEN

Materials: seeds and/or plants, gardening supplies

Start a class garden! Students can plant, water and take care of seeds/plants. Use a terrarium or pots along the windowsill if outside planting space is limited. Have children record what they see every week and measure each plant. Compare measurements to see which plant grows the fastest, slowest, etc.

A NEW LEAF

Gather your own samples or have students bring in a few leaves from their trees at home. As a class or in small groups, guide them through the process of identifying what kind of tree each leaf comes from.
