

## TIME TO READ!

**Before reading:** Take a poll to see how many baby teeth your group has lost. Discuss how kids celebrate losing a tooth. Do they have any special family traditions?

\*Note: This book should be used as a resource. Don't try to read it all at once! Use one or two geographical sections at a time. Locate each country on a map as you go.

"EGG"SPERIMENT (AGES 5-12)

protects our teeth. Place the egg

Materials: 1 hardboiled egg (with shell), vinegar,

Fill the jar with vinegar. Point out the hard shell on

the egg-explain that it protects the egg like enamel

## **RELATED ACTIVITIES**

#### TOOTHBRUSH ART (AGES 5-12)

Materials: paper, paint, toothbrushes

Let kids try painting with toothbrushes! They can use the bristles to paint directly on the paper, dip the bristles in paint and flick specks onto the paper to make an abstract design or a starry sky, or flick the bristles across a piece of cardboard.

#### HEALTHY COLLAGE (AGES 5-12)

Materials: paper, glue, scissors, magazines and food advertisements

Divide a sheet of paper in half. Draw a smiling tooth on one side and a frowning tooth on the other. Cut out pictures of food. Glue healthful, low sugar foods on the smiling tooth side. Put high sugar foods on the frowning tooth side. This activity can be done individually or as a whole group.
