

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October 1, 2018 Monday

Count to ten. Can you count backwards from 10 to 1? Watch the read aloud for *Ten, Nine, Eight* by Molly Bang. Pause the video on each page and count the objects. October 2, 2018 Tuesday

• Go outside and look for signs of fall. Bring a bag or bucket and make a fall collection. Can you find different colors of leaves and acorns on the ground. See how many different objects you can gather. Then visit your library to borrow some fall themed books. Try finding some of the objects you gathered in your books. Look for books like this one, *Discovering My World: Exploring Fall: Leaves Change Color* by Melvin & Gilda Berger. This book has beautiful fall pictures and even includes comprehension questions.
